Release and Application Signature

I understand that submitting an application for a study abroad program does not guarantee acceptance into the program. Candidates must meet program requirements and be approved by the program's faculty coordinator. Participation is also subject to availability; some programs fill up early. You will be contacted by the Program Director to set up an interview, which is required of all applicants to the program.

I further understand that program or individual courses may be cancelled due to low enrollment or other factors and I understand that I will be informed of such a decision no later than 6 weeks before planned departure date or as soon as possible after any adverse circumstances that cause the program to be cancelled. I also understand that enrollment in FREN4120: Le Midi is required and that I must also enroll in FREN4050 or one of the two sections of FREN4080 for the first segment. For the second segment, I must enroll in FREN3010, FREN3020, or FREN4120 at Paul Valéry (and thus in FREN2960, as well), OR in FREN4150.

I hereby authorize officials at any educational institution that I have attended to release my disciplinary records (including but not limited to records maintained by the Judicial Programs and Services Office, the Registrar, the Department of Housing, and/or the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs) to the study abroad program director of the program to which I am applying.
